Nelsonville City Council met in regular session Monday, September 27, 2021, at 7PM. President Dunfee called the meeting to order. All stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Dunfee offered the opening prayer. In the absence of the Council Clerk, Ms. Jones agreed to act as Clerk. **ROLL CALL:** All Council members were present except Mr. Taylor due to work. Mr. Booth will join the meeting later. Mr. Scott Frank, City Manager, and Mr. Bob Toy, City Attorney, were also present. Mr. Sherman made a motion to excuse Mr. Taylor. Mr. Dunfee seconded the motion. **ROLL CALL:** All Council members voted yea.

Mr. Sherman made a motion to approve the minutes of the last regular. Mr. Dunfee seconded the motion. **ROLL CALL**: All Council members voted yea.

AUDITOR/TREASURER'S REPORT

The Auditor gave the Treasurer's report for month June, July, and August 2021. Total funds as of June 30, 2021, was \$3,150,156.12, and invested funds totaled \$1,713,708.02.

Funds as of July 31, 2021, totaled \$3,254,539.23. Total invested funds were \$1,713.839.

Total funds as of August 31, 2021, totaled \$3,354,812.30, and invested funds totaled \$1,713,970.03.

The Auditor reported for the months of June, July, and August 2021. The year-to-date revenue in June totaled \$3,538,580,29. Year-to-date expenses totaled \$3,091,474.51 for an ending balance of \$2,853,505.38.

The year-to-date revenue in July totaled \$4,288,772.24. Year-to-date expenses totaled \$3,826,170.02 for an ending balance of \$2,761,461.35.

The year-to-date revenue in August totaled \$5,068,895.95. Year-to-date expenses totaled \$4,390.830.82 for an ending balance of \$3,026.367.24.

The City received the American Rescue Funds in August which has caused revenue to stay strong. It has been a good year. The Audits have been submitted and approved and the results will be available to the public when they are released. R. Sappington said he was glad to have Mr. Dolezal here tonight. Tax revenue is good, but our software is dated. No one wants to invest in the software except RITA, so he feels it is a no brainer, along with the City Manager and several of the department heads

The Auditor said he two big items that are a worry to him is the census count and the tax changes at the state level that would allow people to request retroactive tax refunds during Covid if their employers sent them home.

Sherman made a motion to approve the Auditor's/Treasurer's Reports as presented. Mr. Dunfee seconded the motion. **ROLL CALL**: All Council members voted yea.

BUISNESS AND ORGANIZATIONS COMMENTS

Mr. Al Dolezal, a representative of the Regional Income Tax Agency (RITA) made a presentation to Council regarding process and depth of their service and the benefits to Nelsonville. RITA does administrative tax work for municipalities. The agency is owned by its members and so is a nonprofit. The key is one overhead which keeps the cost of tax administration down. It is a start to finish administration. They have agreements with the IRS and the State of Ohio. In answer to questions from Ms. Jones, the Auditor said the goal is to increase revenue and decrease costs and overhead in his office. There is no one specifically designated to do tax collections except himself, and it would be helpful to him. It will also make filing taxes easier for residents. Ms. Jones also asked if RITA could work with local tax preparers outside the large companies like H&R Block. Mr. Dolezal said they would need to know what programs are used by the local agencies.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSION

Mr. Dunfee reported on a **Recreation Committee** meeting. They discussed improvements to Polley Field and Nelson Commons. The pool house will be

painted and some of the old lights that were on the square will be repurposed for Nelson Commons. They also discussed moving the playground at Polley Field up towards the front. AEP gifted a ship to be used at the playground.

Ms. Grant reported on a **Finance Committee** meeting where the census was discussed along with the previous attorney's bill. They also talked about the 2022 budget and legislation for the agenda tonight.

Ms. Jones reported on a **Planning and Development Committee** meeting. A request from some residents near the city limit was discussed. They are interested in their properties being moved out of the City. The issue was sent to Mr. Toy for an opinion. They also discussed an AEP grant to put electric vehicle charging stations near the Public Square. Mr. Sherman asked to be informed because he was considering having a charging station at his hotel.

CODE ENFORCEMENT UPDATE

Code Officer, Becky Barber, reported 68 nuisance cases have been written, six citations for Mayor's Court, and nine permits have been issued since her last report. She reminded rental property owners that rental registration forms will be sent in October, and she asked that they please make sure to update the information if necessary. Dave Martin, the city's newest Hap Cap participant, is working at the front desk in the City Manager's office. She also reminded residents that until October 31 grass must be kept to 8" or less.

Landbank update – Jeff Lehman purchased and demoed a house behind his apartments on Chestnut Street. Ms. Barber said there had been a lot of drug and criminal activity at the property. The house at 130 Jefferson Street has been sold to be a restoration project.

WHEREAS, the City of Nelsonville owns a dump truck that is in good working condition that the City no longer needs; and

WHEREAS, the Athens County Engineer has offered to purchase the City's dump truck at a price of Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,000.00); and

WHEREAS, O.R.C § 735.053 authorizes the City to sell equipment to another political subdivision without advertising and bidding by the enactment of an ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the selling price of Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,000.00) is an high price for the City to receive for the dump truck, and an advertising and bidding process would most likely result in a lower selling price for the City

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Manager Scott Frank shall have the authority to sell the City's dump truck to the Athens County Engineer. - 2. The City Manager shall not sell the dump truck at a price any lower than Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,000.00). The City Manager may sell the dump truck at the price of Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,000.00).
- 3. The dump truck to be sold is a 2007 International DT466 with a VIN #1HTWDAAR97J445409.
- 4. The Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$37,000.00) shall be appropriated to the #200 Street Construction Fund upon receipt.
- 5. This Ordinance is being passed as an emergency measure pursuant to O.R.C. 731.30 because the immediate passage of the Ordinance is necessary save maintenance costs on the dump truck and to gain liquid assets for the #200 Street Construction Fund as the County Engineer is paying the full purchase price next week, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption.
